

Walter Ciszek SJ spent fifteen years in forced labour camps in Siberia. Through allthose years he belonged to the lowest brigades doing the

dirtiest work – digging foundations by hand, carving out with pick and shovel long sewer trenches through the frozen ground, loading and unloading with bare hands the heavy construction materials, crawling in damp, dark mines, where death was always only one careless step away. What kept him going? He says: 'Men died in the camp, especially when they gave up hope. But I trusted in God, and so I never felt abandoned or without hope. I owe my survival to my faith in God.' Of all the things we can give another person the greatest is trust. Lord, increase our faith in you, so that we may trust you more fully in all the happenings of our lives, great and small, bitter and sweet.
