





Remembrance Day...Remembrance Day was first observed in 1919 throughout the British Commonwealth. It was originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate the armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November 11, 1918, at 11 am—on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. Every year on November 11, Canadians pause in a moment of silence to honour and remember the men and women who have served, and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict and peace. We remember the more than 2,300,000 Canadians who have served throughout our nation's history and the more than 118,000 who made the ultimate sacrifice. This year, though we may not be able to gather at the cenotaph, we can still honour the brave men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country. Will we continue to remember our war heroes? I hope so. Some say "let the dead bury their dead," however, and with many veterans passing on, the future of Remembrance Day can seem as bleak as the November sky. The lapel pins we wear on Remembrance Day actually started as a fund-raiser for Belgian children orphaned by the Great War. Will our own children care in the future? They should. It is important to use this day as an opportunity to encourage people to think about where we've gotten using war as a solution to our problems, to think about the lives lost and to think about new ways we can make the world a better place. There are so few people left alive who know what a global war is like. Soon, there won't be any. We wear the poppy in remembrance. If the poppy, a symbol of death and loss, doesn't also serve as a potent symbol of the need for peace, what could? You can tell people what happened long ago, and that's history nothing can change it, but it is not something that should be forgotten, nor should the men and women who gave so much for the freedom we now enjoy. On November 11 we remember those who gave their life for others, our war heroes and our first responders.

On The Lighter Side: A child was watching his mother sift through and delete a long list of junk E-mail on the computer screen. "This reminds me of the Lord's Prayer," the child said. "What do you mean?" the mother asked. "You know. That part about 'deliver us from E-mails."

Communion Reflection..We are born in exile and die there too. As soon as we set sail on the great voyage of life, we begin our return. When we die, we do not so much go to God as return to him. Like homesick cranes that fly night and day back to their mountain nests, so let all our lives take their voyage to you, O Lord. For you have made us for yourself, and our hearts will never rest, until they rest in you. Only those who have flown home to You have flown at all.

During the month of November, we take the time to pause and remember those who have died and await the resurrection of the body at the end of time, especially those in our parish cemeteries. "May the Lord grant eternal rest to them and send his comfort and strength to us, the living, as we look forward to our reunion, one day, in the glory of God's eternal kingdom in heaven."

Envelopes for All Souls are available at the back of the Church and may be placed in front of the Altar for the month of November. The names will be remembered at the Masses during the year, along with candles at the altar.
