The Apostolic Penitentiary explains that "in order to increase the devotion of the faithful and for the salvation of souls," grandparents, the elderly and the faithful will be able to obtain a Plenary Indulgence on the First World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly to be celebrated on 25 July. The note says that the Pope has granted this possibility after having listened to the request presented by Cardinal Kevin Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, establishing the World Day that will be observed every year on the 4th Sunday of July. 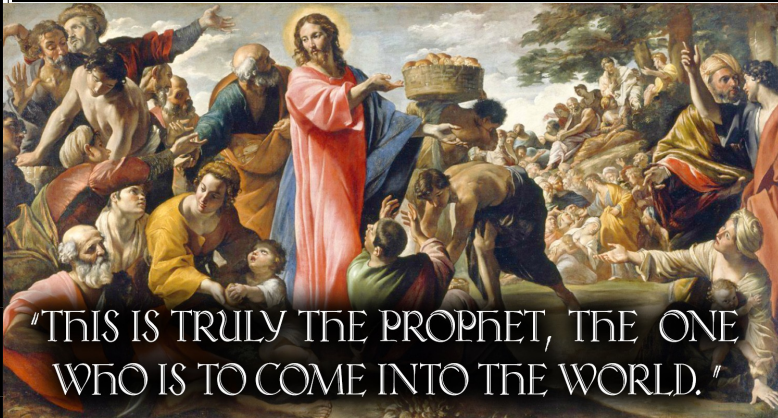

Stories of Inspiration - Coping with Change

Ben, a 66-year-old man with a developmental disability, lives with his 90-year-old mother. While the mother and son are inseparable, she realized that she hadn't made any plans for her son should anything happen to her. She has been widowed for 25 years and Ben has no siblings. He is terrified of group homes and the thought of leaving his mother. Through Mary Centre's respite program, a ShareLife Funded agency, Ben was matched with a respite worker. As they began to build a relationship, he took Ben to one of Mary Centre's group homes to make friends with the men and women living there. When the day comes that Ben needs to move into a Mary Centre home, the transition will be less overwhelming.

Stewardship Reflection - 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

1st Reading: 2 Kings 4:42-44 **2nd Reading:** Ephesians 4.1-6
Gospel: John 6:1-15 - *God Answers All Our Needs*

Today we hear the familiar story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 men plus women and children on just five loaves and two fish. The reading from 2 Kings also speaks of God's miraculous feeding of a crowd. These passages remind us that nothing is impossible for God, and that He wants to feed His people.

Add in Psalm 145, and you see the overall message for today: God will provide EVERYTHING we need — not just food – and He will do so abundantly!

Sometimes in our discipleship, it is easy to fall into the lie that we are the ones doing all the work and that it is up to us to solve the world's problems. The truth is, our Heavenly Father already has the solutions, we need only look to Him in faith and hope! And we might need to be prepared for a solution that defies reason, like feeding over 5,000 people with a meager sack lunch! Don't make excuses! Don't try to point out the flaws in God's plan. Simply take action and believe. God will "satisfy the desire of every living thing."

What are some ways that God has shown you His abundance? How can you respond to His generosity with thankfulness?

Church in Canada celebrates grandparents and the elderly

The first-ever World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated this Sunday under the theme “I am with you always” (Mt 28: 20).

Ahead of the inaugural celebration, the Canadian Bishops’ Conference Standing Committee for Family and Life (CCCB) released a video message (<https://youtu.be/wDCo3vNhJZU>) inviting young people, families and communities to draw near and to spend time with grandparents and the elderly, cherishing and valuing their essential role in Church and society.

This first World Day is part of Pope Francis’ larger idea for the *Amoris Laetitia* Family Year which runs from 19 March 2021 – June 2022. The year highlights the importance of pastoral care of the elderly within the Christian community, encouraging us to spend time with one another and engage in intergenerational conversations.

While instituting the World Day at the Sunday Angelus on January 31, Pope Francis announced that it would take place each year on the 4th Sunday in July, close to the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

The Lord and the Church are close to the elderly

“On this First World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, we give thanks to God for each of you and the many gifts He grants to us through you,” are the words with which the video message addressed to the elderly begins.

Holding up the theme of the celebration, the CCCB assured the elderly that in spite of the uncertain and turbulent times, the Lord and the Church are close to them. More so, “the Holy Father wishes to remind the whole world that the voice of the elderly is precious, because it sings the praises of God and preserves the roots of the peoples.”

The Elderly: Keepers of the faith and “our storytellers”

The CCCB’s message said, expressing joy in the “great gift” that the elderly are, for the Church and Society.

“You are keepers of the faith, steadfast and persevering,” they noted, adding that Saint John Paul II wrote that the elderly are “guardians of our collective memory which support and guide life in society.”

Mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer

The video message then reminded the elderly of the mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer entrusted to them by Pope Francis, inviting them pray for an outpouring of grace upon their families and communities, and to let the joy of the Gospel transform their lives so that they may continue to encourage those who suffer and are lost.

“Just as you help young people to believe in their dreams for the future, our wish is that you too, will continue to contemplate the wonder and beauty of God’s gift of life.

The bishops also urged grandparents not to be discouraged by the pandemic and its effects, adding that through mutual support and helping one another, “we will heal from heart-ache caused by sadness and isolation.”

The video message concluded with a note of gratitude to all grandparents and the elderly, and an invitation to all, to walk together with them through this stage of life, each of us, holding our fragilities and limitations.

“Together we praise the Lord of life and love with the words of the psalmist, ‘You show me the path of life, in your presence, there is fullness of life (Ps 16:11).”

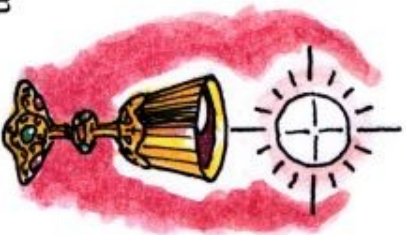

# Jesus Multiplies our Gifts



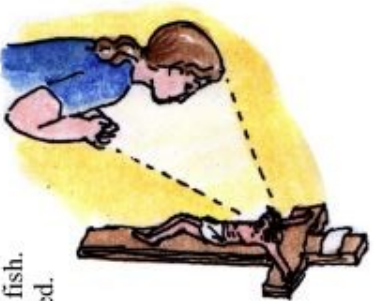

We have something to offer to Jesus too. If you offer your work, or your talents, or even your whole life to God, He will use your gifts to bring His blessings to the world.



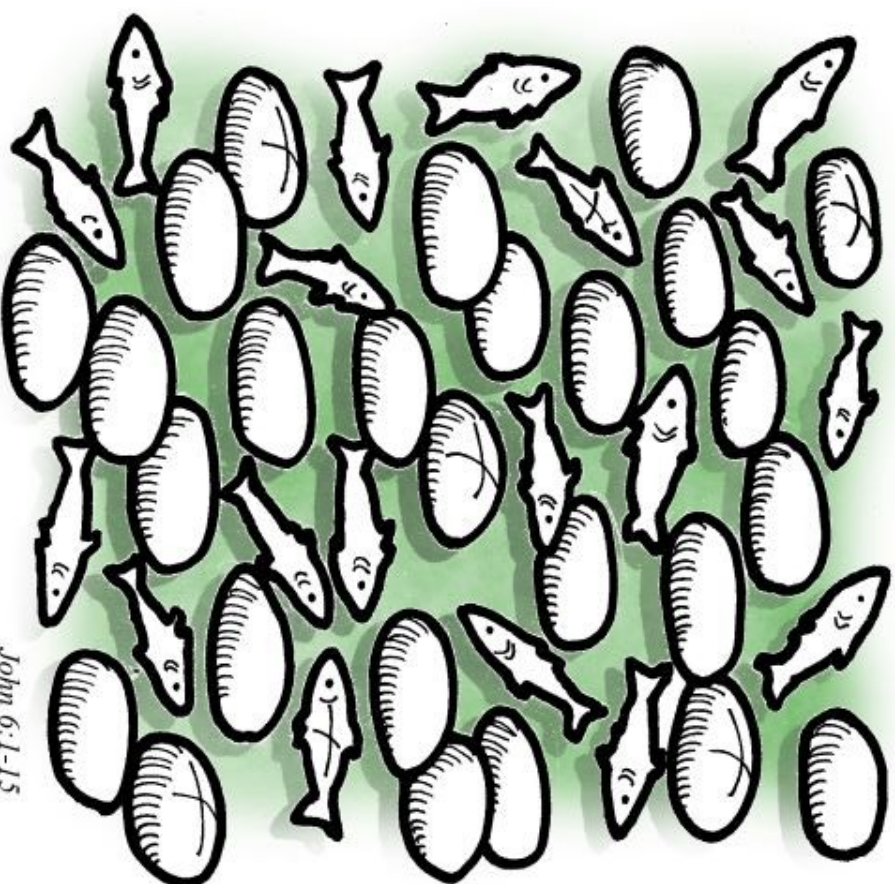
