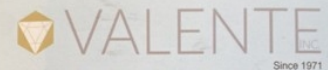

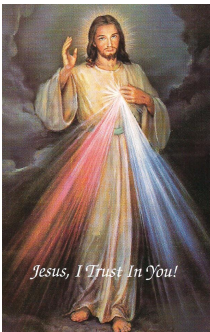
“Whomever eats this bread lives forever”

Life’s problems finds them looking for solutions but without a place to search. Eventually, they find their strength in the God they ignored for so long. It gives us bearings and thus enables us to live in a topsy-turvy world without getting lost or giving in to despair. Just as swimmers trust that if they don’t panic, and if they do a few simple things, then the power of the sea will uphold them, so believers entrust their lives to a power greater than us all. This power is the power of God, who brought his Son, Jesus, back from the dead.

Garden of Lilies...Easter is a time when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and remember our loved ones. Thank you to everyone that purchased an Easter Lily in memory of a loved one.



Most of us have blind spots, presumptions, ideas and perceptions that we don't even think about changing. These blind spots are major roadblocks in our spiritual journey. They can cause untold harm to others and to ourselves.

LET US PRAY... GOD, give me eyes that I might see the work that can be done by me. GOD, give me ears that I might hear the cries of those who need me near. GOD, give me hands that I might do some large or simple task for you. GOD, give me prayer that I might pray for help and guidance every day. And this one thing above all else above, GOD, give me a heart that I might love.



Any blind spots that we possess are there because we have developed them. This development was not done at random. We carefully chose our blind spots to protect us from something that is perceived as a threat. Prejudice is a blind spot. We think that those who are different from us are a threat to us, and so we develop a distance from them. We come to fear what they will do to us. We can see that our blind spots are not rational. They come from fear. This is why we can't argue a person out of their blindness. They are emotionally unable to listen to us. Only conversion works to help people see. But to be converted we must be open to receiving new sight. This is why prayer can be the first step towards sight. In prayer we open ourselves to God working within us. If in our prayer, we sincerely and continually ask God to reveal those parts of ourselves that we refuse to look at, we can be sure that God will answer our prayers.
