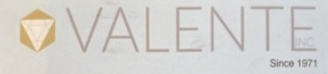

From the Pastor's Desk



We like to hear stories of upward mobility, inspiring accounts of people who have risen from the depth of poverty and deprivation to achieve notable success in society, business or government. But the way of the cross is the pathway of downward mobility. The Son of God emptied himself of his divine prerogative as God's equal, so he could be like us in every way-except without sin. For the sake of our eternal salvation, Jesus suffered the ultimate humiliation of dying the death of a common criminal. Christ has lifted us up so we might spend our life lifting others up. This is the pathway to humble, sacrificial service. It is the way of the cross, the way of Christ.

Pope Leo XIV@Pontifex...The Church interprets history through the lens of the Gospel and speaks decisively against all evil, as the pilgrim People of God. At the same time, she acknowledges the need for continual conversion so she may properly fulfill her mission. As members of the same Body, we are called to renewal.



As we go through each stage of our life, we look in the mirror occasionally and our thoughts go from hope to discouragement. A young boy or girl looks in the mirror and awaits the day when he will be a strong, handsome young man or she will be a beautiful woman. As time passes, they take pride in their looks. As more time passes, they wonder why age has taken such a toll. It might help to remind ourselves that God chose the instrument of the human body to redeem the world. Jesus started, as we all did, with an infant's body and sacrificed His young thirty-three old life on the cross. In between time, He dealt with the young and old who crossed His path. No one was rejected because of their age or physical condition. As we look in the mirror, realize that each year may have taken its toll but also has made its contribution to your being able to draw closer to the God who made you. Young or old we are the Lord's and He would have it no other way.

Communion Reflection...Six year old Molly complained to her mother that her stomach hurt. Realizing it was almost lunch time, Mom told Molly, "Your stomach is empty; you'll feel better after you put something in it." Later that evening, the Pastor came over for a visit. During the conversation, he mentioned he had a headache. Molly piped up with a solution: "That's because it's empty. You'll feel better when you put something in it." In our weakness, in our need, in our desperation, we are to look at the cross of Christ. Things may not automatically change, but we will gain strength and confidence. Christ already knows our pain. When we join our suffering with his, we are not alone. We live in him.



Some people seek a feel-good faith that will help them avoid distress and pain and sorrow. Others adopt one of our society's current, distorted values: "You should do whatever will make you happy." Our new

life in Christ will ultimately bring us joy and peace beyond measure, when we see our Saviour, "face to face." But in the meantime, we will inevitably suffer hurt and rejection as we stand up for Christ and work for what is good and right and true in the sight of God. We will encounter pain and sorrow as we confront the corrupt values of our society and work for the good of those whom Jesus calls "the least of these who are members of my family." But yet we can "rejoice in the Lord always" because the joy of the Lord is hidden in pain and sorrow. And no one can rob us of the joy we find in him.

Communion Reflection... We are born in exile and die there too. As soon as we set sail on the great voyage of life, we begin our return. We spend our lives dreaming of a homeland we have never seen. Like homing birds that are released in a strange country, and know no rest until they return home, so it is with us. When we die, we do not so much go to God as return to Him. You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts will never rest until they rest in you.

May is The Month of Mary

One sign of the Christian spirit is that our thoughts turn to the spiritual side of each season of the year. The month of December brings thoughts of Christmas; March is linked in our thoughts with Lent and Easter; October is the month of the rosary. And the month of May brings us memories of Mary and reminds us of our devotion to her. The union of the month of May and Mary is quite natural. The very names are interchangeable. The mood of May is the mood of hope and joy; Mary is the mother of hope and the cause of our joy. Ancient traditions have embedded themselves in the language and customs of every Christian nation. Sometimes we might wonder if we have lost our spiritual joy. In Canada we have few, if any, religious fiestas or festivals or processions with music and banners. But the month of May reminds us that joy is for the taking. As we honor Mary, may our devotion to her lead us to love and serve God joyfully. We can let go of grudging, reluctant duty, remembering instead our loving God and Mary our Mother. Then there will be springtime in our souls and Mary's own Maytime in our hearts.



During the month of May we encourage you to pray the Rosary.

LET US PRAY... GOD, give me eyes that I might see the work that can be done by me. GOD, give me ears that I might hear the cries of those who need me near. GOD, give me lips that I might speak comfort and peace to all that seek. GOD, give me a mind that I might know to help the ones that need me so. GOD, give me hands that I might do some large or simple task for you. GOD, give me prayer that I might pray for help and guidance every day. And this one thing above all else above, GOD, give me a heart that I might love.



This week's 2nd Collection - Papal Charities...This week, there will be a second collection for the Pope's Pastoral Works. These funds are passed on to the Holy Father for immediate response in countries stricken by war, famine and natural disasters. The Pope's Pastoral Works displays Christ's love and compassion for people in desperate need. Please give generously.



When we remember the Ascension of Our Lord into Heaven we also remember that Jesus promised the Holy Spirit as a guide and comforter. Jesus is no longer with us as a human being but He lives in our hearts. We feel the Holy Spirit dwelling within us and in the face of others. Jesus wants us to be fully immersed in God's will just as He is. Jesus wants us to see the world transformed by love and grace with every decision that we make. Perhaps we discover that it is not we who live, but Christ who lives in us.
