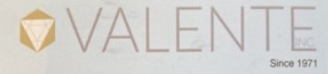

Pope Leo XIV@Pontifex...The Lord commands us to love one another as He has loved us (cf. Jn 13:34): it is the love of Jesus that gives birth to love in us. Christ Himself is the criterion of true love: love that is faithful forever, pure and unconditional, love that gives without wanting to possess.

Communion Reflection...For me, Holy Communion has come to mean connectedness. Can we take the grace of Jesus, the love of God, and the Communion of the Holy Spirit and turn all three into a benediction, a wondrous blessing of the fellowship we have with one another in Christ Jesus? When we the people of God come together around the Altar of the Lord to eat of the same bread, we are drawn together in saying, Any friend of Jesus is a friend of mine. It's no longer you over there, me over here and Jesus way out there somewhere, it's you and I together with Jesus right there in the heart of our relationship. This has been Jesus' dream all along.



A friend told me of his less-than-perfect efforts at running marathons. He was in good physical condition in university, so he figured he could do the run without much trouble. Somewhere along the 7 km mark, his legs and knees started to buckle. He would have fallen to the ground had it not been for two fellow runners who supported him long enough for him to regain some strength and continue the race. When he shared that story, I was reminded of St. Paul's comparing life to a race in which all the runners press forward to claim the prize at the finish line. Though the race is long and hard, the key to winning is keeping our eyes on Christ, knowing we have the support of others to cheer us on.



The feast of Pentecost is, in a very real way, our communal birthday celebration. With the coming of the Spirit, the Church comes into the fullness of its life. The Spirit came upon the apostles and they preached the fullness of the life of Jesus, the "Good News" of salvation. In the early Christian communities, belief in the power of the Spirit was so strong and intense that wonderful experiences occurred. In the midst of all the changes and renewal that we have experienced in today's church, we cannot help but be struck by the movement of the Holy Spirit. The life of Christ has been felt in a new way by so many Christians. No longer can we call ourselves Catholic and have it remain a name. We are summoned to a dynamic witness of the Gospel. It is not always an easy task, but we can be confident that the Spirit of God is upon us to give us all the assistance we need. Let us all re-commit ourselves today to the life of the Spirit; let us renew the promises of our Confirmation. Let us make our own lives more vibrant witnesses of the Gospel message of Jesus. Let us make the life of our parish a witness of all that we believe.



Life is filled with small annoyances that can sometimes cause us to lose perspective on what's really important. We all have occasional aches and pains along with the physical consequences of doing things for which we were long ago out of shape. Most of us just grin and bear it while some dwell on these annoyances to the point of forgetting what's also going well in their lives. Jesus spoke of our Heavenly Father knowing whatever it is we need. He asked us to consider the passing beauty of the lilies of the field and pointed out that our Father will provide many more gifts of a permanent nature to each of us. While some say they believe this, they still complain constantly about life's little annoyances. Isn't it strange how those with genuinely serious troubles usually wear the biggest smile.

May is The Month of Mary

One sign of the Christian spirit is that our thoughts turn to the spiritual side of each season of the year. The month of December brings thoughts of Christmas; March is linked in our thoughts with Lent and Easter; October is the month of the rosary. And the month of May brings us memories of Mary and reminds us of our devotion to her. The union of the month of May and Mary is quite natural. The very names are interchangeable. The mood of May is the mood of hope and joy; Mary is the mother of hope and the cause of our joy. Ancient traditions have embedded themselves in the language and customs of every Christian nation. Sometimes we might wonder if we have lost our spiritual joy. In Canada we have few, if any, religious fiestas or festivals or processions with music and banners. But the month of May reminds us that joy is for the taking. As we honor Mary, may our devotion to her lead us to love and serve God joyfully. We can let go of grudging, reluctant duty, remembering instead our loving God and Mary our Mother. Then there will be springtime in our souls and Mary's own Maytime in our hearts.
