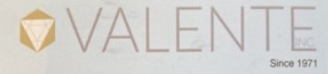

Rev. Mr. Rafał Michał Bartosiński, 41, I grew up in Poland. The very important moment of my life was the death of Pope John Paul II. It was then that I felt that the Lord was calling me to enter the seminary, though it took him a few years before I decided to go. Meantime, I studied theology at the University of Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński and worked. In 2009, I joined a community of the Neocatechumenal Way. It was in this community in 2011, I made the decision to enter the Seminary. I was sent to the Redemptoris Mater Missionary Seminary of Toronto where I had one year of missionary experience in Israel and was sent to Blessed Sacrament Parish for my internship year. I am now finishing theological studies at Saint Augustine's. I was ordained on June 27<sup>th</sup> 2020 by Cardinal Thomas Collins and worked as an associate Pastor at St. John Chrysostom Parish in Newmarket from 2020-2023, Guardian Angels Parish in Orillia from 2023-2025 and currently St. Joseph Parish in Mississauga. 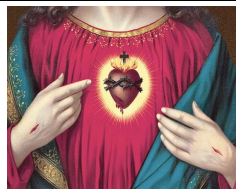

Some people don't want to accept their need for change. A story is told about a doctor who told a man to give up red meat—and so he stopped

putting ketchup on his hamburgers. Another story: Randy was unsure about his choice of clothes for attending church, so he sought council from his wife. He asked, "Do you think I should change?" She took advantage of the opportunity and replied, "It depends—are you talking about changing your shirt or making a wholesale change as a human being?" We are not interested in merely changing the externals. We want sincere life-altering corrections. It is useless to change a shirt if we continue our sinful ways. It's not so much about T-shirt versus dress shirt, as it is about fighting, holding grudges and backbiting. These must go. If you want, then you can change your shirt as well.

**Communion Reflection...** There was a preacher, one day he was passing a large church when he spotted people selling their trinkets, food items, and religious articles. There was incense, candles, veils and rosaries for sale. What caught his eye was several small boys selling crosses. In a loud enthusiastic voice they shouted, "Crosses, cheap crosses for sale! Get your cheap cross today!" Crosses are not cheap. Jesus' cross certainly wasn't and ours are not either. The cross is the challenge in following Jesus. We have to say no to our selfish desires. Though often in this world we do not follow God's values. That can be a challenge. In our pain, we don't curse our struggles but offer them up in union with Jesus, for the cross leads to life. Not only in the next life, but right here. We live in union with Christ. It is worth the sacrifice.



There is nothing like a humble heart. We may sin and sin gravely, but a humble, contrite spirit touches God's mercy. God desires to forgive and restore us to his love and friendship. Yet pride and hardness of heart act as a roadblock. Now is a good time to humbly turn to God and seek his forgiveness. Confession may be just the place to begin. Father, I can fool myself sometimes. I can think that I am pretty good, or at least better than most. I realize how foolish that is. If I have avoided any sin, it is because of your grace. I want to admit my brokenness. I come before you, seeking forgiveness. Forgive me so that I may return to you wholeheartedly.

**Communion Reflection...** A preschool aged boy was eating an apple in the back seat of the car. "Daddy," he said, "why is my apple turning brown?" The boy's father explained, "Because after you ate the skin off, the meat of the apple came in contact with the air, which caused it to oxidize, thus changing its molecular structure and turning it into a different colour." There was a long silence, and then the boy asked, "Daddy, are you talking to me?" Jesus is talking to us. Thankfully, he speaks in a language that we can understand. Jesus keeps it simple. Do you want to know how to live in this world? Simple: treat others as you wish to be treated. Who can't understand that? Unfortunately, we often live as if those words were incomprehensible. They are not. Keep life simple; do unto others as you would have them do unto you.
