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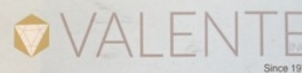
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Mass Intentions

It was then that I felt that the Lord was calling me to enter the seminary, though it took him a few years before I decided to go. In the meantime, I studied theology at the University of Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński and worked. In 2009, I joined a community of the Neocatechumenal Way. It was in this community in 2011, I made the decision to enter the Seminary. I was sent to the Redemptoris Mater Missionary Seminary of Toronto where I had one year of missionary experience in Israel and was sent to Blessed Sacrament Parish for my internship year. I am now finishing theological studies at Saint Augustine's. I was ordained on June 27th 2020 by Cardinal Thomas Collins and worked as an associate Pastor at St. John Chrysostom Parish in Newmarket from 2020-2023, Guardian Angels Parish in Orillia from 2023-2025 and St. Joseph Parish in Mississauga from 2025-2026. Communion Reflection...After a 67 year old carpenter died, his will contained a staggering set of bequests. Included in his plan for distribution was more than \$2 billion for his city, another \$1.5 billion for the province and \$2.5 billion for the parks department. To top off the list, he left \$6 trillion to the government to help pay off the national debt. That sounds amazingly generous, but there was a small problem—his only asset when he died was a 1983 Oldsmobile. The carpenter was quite generous. Well, at least in his mind. Sometimes, that is as far as our generosity goes. We think about it and it goes no further. Do you want to receive abundant blessing from God? Then give abundantly to others. What you give shall be given back to you. Or, give little and receive little. It is simple heavenly economics.

Communion Reflection...In general we reap what we sow. We can't expect to reap good if we have sown evil. We must sow peace if we do not want to reap conflict. We must sow loyalty if we do not want to reap betrayal. We must sow honesty if we do not want to reap deceit. Even though we have no absolute guarantee that what we sow will always fall on good ground, or that someone else may not come along and sow contrary seed, nevertheless, if we are careful to sow good seeds we, within reason, trust our expectations because nature has shown that if what is planted bears fruit at all, it will yield more of itself. So, let us sow good seed.



A man visited Yellowstone Park where he saw a grizzly bear. The huge animal was in the center of a clearing, feeding on some discarded camp food. For several minutes, the bear feasted alone—no other creature

dared draw near. After a few moments, a skunk walked through the meadow toward the food and took his place next to the grizzly. The bear didn't object—and the man knew why—it would cost the bear too much to get even. We may be able to get even with our enemies, but is it worth it? It may appear so, when judging by our human standards, but not in God's value system. We should treat those we dislike, those who have harmed us, as we would our friends. Wow—that is a challenge! If we don't, what would make us any different from nonbelievers? Everyone is nice to those who are nice to them. We Christians must go the extra mile. Easy? No. But possible, yes.

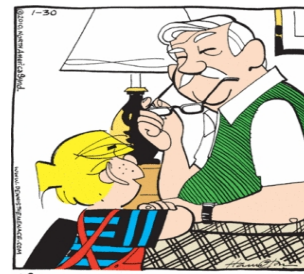
